To be a veterinary cattle practitioner in Denmark is to love diversity of work, being allowed to be both a craftsman and an advisor in the challenging and inspirational environment of modern Dairy management. Calving aid and surgery form the base for the need to be skilled in the practical uses of your profession. The increased demand for prevention of infection, optimization of production and general management aid gives you the chance to use analytical skills, educational aptitude, and in debt knowledge of modern production . The legislation of both EU and Denmark makes it needed to posses good administrative skills, both to keep your own registrations correct but also to give much needed aid to the farmers that do not posses similar interest or aptitude. You need to be able to educate farmers, move in their circles and still keep your head up to keep the overview of the entire production and the deep interconnectivity of all the different aspects of this. How you feed the calves affect how the cows will produce years after! Come look at a Danish dairy farm, and get a small taste of how we think the future cattle practitioner will be working in Denmark.
